Impact

Parents and children tell us that Pupil Premium Funding has helped them to receive extra tuition, either in lessons, after school or in the holidays and this has significantly improved their progress and achievement.

Parents value the advice and practical support given by the Parent Support Advisor.

Pupils have had access to extra-curricular activities which they wouldn't have been able to afford, including music tuition and sports' coaching. This has developed their talents, raised self confidence and self esteem.

The data below indicates how much average progress was made by children in receipt of Pupil Premium against those who were not, in the core areas of learning. It should be recognised that the number of Pupil Premium children is very small at Brimscombe and are unevenly distributed across the year groups. However, we are pleased that our "individual approach" to supporting our Pupil Premium children appears to be accelerating their progress and closing the gap.
